◆ ISSUE

The board is being asked to open a period of public comment on regulations related to the qualification and certification of Alaska educators.

♦ BACKGROUND

- The proposed regulation is in response to the statutory changes to teacher certification requirements made by Senate Bill (SB) 20 Out-of-State Teacher Reciprocity that was signed into law on September 4, 2022 (Chapter 69, SLA 2022). The effective date of this new law is December 3, 2022.
- SB 20 simplified the qualification for experienced teachers holding a valid, regular outof-state teaching certificate by removing the additional testing requirements and allowing for immediate application for a Professional certificate.
- The proposed regulations require educators to have at least two years of teaching experience in addition to the valid, regular out-of-state teaching certificate to qualify for the Professional certificate and provides a timeline for satisfying the Alaska studies/Alaska multicultural coursework and mandatory training requirements.
- To streamline the application process for spouses of active military members, the
 proposed regulations describe the documentation that will be needed in addition to the
 Professional Out-of-State teacher application to receive expediated processing by the
 department.
- The proposed regulations can be found behind this cover memo.
- Susan McKenzie, Director of the Division of Innovation and Education Excellence; Sondra Meredith, Administrator of Teacher Education and Certification; and Susan Sonneborn, Assistant Attorney General, will be present to brief the board.
