Note from the Superintendent

Applications for the 2023-2024 are now open and available on our website. The 33rd Legislative Session is underway, and I gave my first presentation to the House Education Committee this morning. Basketball season brings a welcome influx of visitors to our gym, including parents who come to see their children compete. The pep band enhances the school spirit that has always been strong and supportive. Multiple squads of cheerleaders lead the crowd as they support our varsity and junior varsity boys and girls teams. Both boys and girls have multiple C teams, whose fundraising allowed them to travel last weekend

Mt. Edgecumbe High School was selected to participate in the MTSS Refresh Cohort program, and the team meets monthly under the direction and guidance of Jacob Edwards of Safe and Civil Schools, sponsored by the Alaska Staff Development Network. The team traveled to the RTI Conference in Anchorage and met virtually with our mid-size city cohort last week.

The Advisory Board meets this week for their annual in-person meeting. This year, the Advisory Board scheduled the meeting to take place during Founders Week rather than Graduation, and we have scheduled a day of training with the Alaska Association of School Boards the day prior.

Founders Week celebrates the founding of MEHS, with mini-lessons featured in all social studies class for the next week. All five dance groups, along with a combined Sitka Tlingit group, will be performing at the Gathering of Cultures on Wednesday evening. The Unangan and Sugpiaq groups will have their debut. Art workshops this week include Northwest Coast Art with Will Peterson, Beading Earrings with Jamie Bradley, and Fish Skin Sewing with Karen McIntyre. We will hold exhibition Spelling Bees in Inupiaq, Yup'ik and possibly Tlingit. The Founders Banquet features slow-roast beef brisket, fry bread, salmon spread, and akutaq, among other dishes. The Keynote address will be given by Yeidikook'aa (Dionne Brady-Howard), long-time teacher and graduate of Mt. Edgecumbe.

COVID and Health Update

As a residential school, we continue to maintain responsibility for testing our students for COVID-19 when they present with cold-like symptoms. Since the last report, we have had isolated cases with no more than two at a time. One student had to stay a few extra days over winter break to complete quarantine before returning home. Staff stepped in to ensure the student was well cared for. We have had a total of 6 cases since the last report. Our campus has remained COVID-free since January 29th.

Current Enrollment

Our enrollment rates are comparable to previous years at this point. We tied the record low for students who elected not to come back over winter break, with only 8 students staying home.
